1: Support

I would say that the college was very supportive throughout the entire Erasmus experience. We were welcomed warmly to the college on the first day from the International office representative. Everyone was very friendly and helpful to us and couldn't do more for us when we had questions. My accomodation was in Hergiswil just outside Lucerne. It was a great, safe location right beside the lake! The name of the accommodation is Universe 9 and its great if you want to meet new people as there are lots of rooms available. It cost about €700 a month but this included all utilities and free access to washing machines and dryers. Due to the accommodation being in Lucerne, I would recommend getting a GA card for public transport. It costs around €300 a month. While this might seem expensive at first, it definitely works out as the best deal if you're planning on traveling around Switzerland or commuting to college every day. Food can be expensive but if you shop in Aldi or Lidl it is much cheaper.

We had individual piano and singing lessons along with courses that were more theory based. It was great to see the different courses that are available in other countries!
