1.	Take the class vocabulary list of the unit you are working on (at the back of your Young World Activity Book)	
2.	 Carefully copy as many words as you can (at least 10) from that vocabulary list into the empty grid: use a pencil write only in CAPITAL LETTERS write horizontally from left to right → write vertically from top to bottom ↓ The words can touch each other and even cross over, for example, like the words 'vegetable' and 'cheese' cross over in the example to the right''. 6.	Only now fill in all the empty fields with capital letters. 8.	Collect the work of your classmates and correct it. Check their spelling carefully	

To make your word search harder, you can also write words from right to left, from bottom to the top or diagonally in all possible directions.
