1. Animal facts

1. Why do storks fly south?
Storks do not like cold weather, so every year they fly south to spend the winter in Africa.
2. What is something we still do not know about storks?
We are still not sure how they find their way home.
3. Describe how pigs greet each other.
They say hello to a friend by making nose-to-nose contact or by licking him or her.
4. Explain two special calls chickens use to communicate.
A hen tells other hens in her group when she finds food and even makes a special call when she finds food that she likes very much. Hens also use different alarm calls to warn each other of danger (a fox or other enemy on land or in the sky).
5. How can ants breathe?
Ants breathe through small holes all over their bodies.
6. Write down two things you have learned about cows.

7. Describe three different ways fish can give their bodies a break.
To give their body a break from swimming, some fish stay in one place, some build a nest and some hide themselves in coral.
8. What can fish do when they open their mouths?
Fish use their mouths to collect food, to build homes and take care of their children (some fish open their mouths and let their babies swim inside if they are in danger).
