## **Ensure correct preparation for the collection service**

Refuse and organic waste are collected weekly throughout the catchment area. Exceptions apply to refuse collection in areas where underground containers have already been installed (see www.zugmap.ch/abfallsammelstellen).

Street collections for paper, cardboard (Baar and Cham only) and scrap metal (Baar only) are organised by the municipalities (www.sammelkalender.ch or collection calender app). Paper must be provided at the side of the road bundled and tied (no paper bags).

The waste must be made available at the collection point by 7:00 a.m. on the day of collection.


#### Refuse:

May only be left in refuse sacks which are subject to a charge.

Must be disposed of in the container. Branches/cuttings bundled up to max. 1.50m length and max. 20 kg.
